RAISING AWARENESS ABOUT CARBON MONOXIDE POISONING



Carbon monoxide is a potentially deadly gas produced any time a carbon-based fuel burns, such as gasoline, propane, charcoal, or oil. Sources on your boat include gasoline engines, generators, cooking ranges, and space/water heaters. It is colorless, odorless, and tasteless and mixes evenly with the air.

Early symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning: headache, nausea, weakness, and dizziness – and are often confused with seasickness or intoxication. Prolonged exposure to low concentrations or very short exposure to high concentrations can lead to death. Each year boaters are injured or killed by carbon monoxide.

What Can YOU Do?

1. Be Educated. Understand the risks, problem scenarios, and symptoms. For more information, go to www.uscgbuoating.org.
2. Join DAF's efforts along with the Colorado Parks and Wildlife and all 50 states' Boating Law Administrators, to include a set of illustrations demonstrating the risks of carbon monoxide (CO) in their Boating Regulation Brochures.
3. Be a smart boater! Watch for blocked exhaust outlets, exhaust from other vessels close by, slow speeds/idling, and the "station wagon effect."

DOUBLE ANGEL FOUNDATION PENDANT

The pendant is designed from the Double Angel logo in memory of Dillon and Logan Dixey, two young brothers who drowned from exposure to carbon monoxide while swimming at the rear of their houseboat in August 2000. The Double Angel Pendant is delicately fashioned as two small angels forming a heart to signify the love and nurturing shared by their family. Proceeds from the sale of the pendant were used to help build the Double Angel Ballpark and will continue to be used for helping support the Double Angel baseball/softball scholarship program; the game that Dillon and Logan loved so much. The proceeds will also help spread the danger and awareness of carbon monoxide poisoning, especially in the marine environment. The pendant is available in yellow-gold, white-gold and sterling silver.
